Preparing for your Pathway Planning Appointment

Before your appointment you should:

- Research learning and work pathways, entrance requirements and pre-requisites for University and VET.
- Study the resources placed in the Connect Year 10 - 2019 Library Folder > WACE information:
 - The Student Career Exploration Workbook,
 - The School Curriculum and Standards Authority Handbook for Year 12, 2021 and website, <https://senior-secondary.scsa.wa.edu.au/>
 - The ORSHS Curriculum Handbook - Pathways and Course Selections, Year 11 & 12, 2020,
 - University Admissions 2022 and TAFE Admissions Guide.
- Login to SSO**, your SSO login and password were sent by email to your parent/guardian. **View your APPOINTMENT booking**, record the date and time on the cover of this Student Guide.
- In SSO view course information, proposed charges and grade pre-requisites.
- Use your Pathway Plan to select **SIX courses** including English.
ATAR or General English is essential for WACE.
- If your **OLNA – Numeracy is CAT 2 or 1**, select a Mathematics course.
- If your pathway is **ATAR**, select a minimum of four ATAR courses.
- Choose carefully as you will study the six courses for two full years. **Changes are restricted by SCOSA enrolment deadlines and course availability.**
- If you selected a **Certificate Qualification** you require a Training **USI**, visit the website <https://www.usi.gov.au/> to create your USI and then forward the USI **email to the VET coordinator.**

Completing your Year 11 Subject Selections Online (SSO)

- 1 **SSO opens 18 June, 2019.** Check your parent's email for SSO login and password.
 - 2 SSO closes **9am Monday, 29 July 2019, (Term 3 Week 2).**
 - 3 Visit the school's website home page: <http://www.oceanreef.wa.edu.au/>
 - 4 Select STUDENTS or PARENT PORTAL and then the SSO logo.
 - 5 Enter your SSO username and password.
 - 6 Select SIX courses.
 - available to select,
 - not available to select, ATAR prerequisite grade NOT achieved.
- If you have not met the pre-requisite grade:
- click to request an override,
 - write your reason,
 - 
 - wait for a response by email.
- 7 **\$** select this symbol to read the proposed course charges.
 - i** Select this symbol to read the course descriptor.
 - 8 A Parent Pin is emailed after the student's pathway appointment; it is a digital signature to confirm the selections made in SSO:
 - enter the Parent Pin and
 - click Validate.
 - 9 Generate SSO Selection Report, download or select email. Retain for your record only.
 - 10 After SSO selections close, course and charges are confirmed and approved by the September meeting of the School Board, SSO will reopen and BPoint payment will be accepted.
