# SPECIALIST LEARNING PROGRAM - AUTISM

## Opportunity

The Specialist Learning Program (SLP) is an endorsed educational program for students with Autism, within or outside boundaries for Ocean Reef Senior High, from Year 7 to 12, resourced by the School of Special Educational Needs.

The program provides education and support for the social/emotional development of students with a diagnosis of autism, who have the potential to achieve academic success in mainstream schooling and beyond. Students attend lessons in mainstream classrooms, the SLP teaching area, as well as community settings.

Some of the SLP's key features are a supervised courtyard for break times, a quiet area for students needing to self-regulate, specialised education assistants and teacher support, as well as Very Important Life Skills (VILS) and study skills lessons.

## Selection

An applicant will need to meet the following criteria:

- Diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder (reports from Paediatrician and other relevant professionals).
- Academically capable of understanding and coping with grade level content and tasks.
- Manages behaviour independently or through the use of pre-determined prompts/strategies.
- Independently manages personal care.

## ENROLMENT SELECTION PROCESS

Parents who are applying for their child to enter the Specialist Learning Program - Autism at Ocean Reef Senior High School will need to follow the timeline below and attach the appropriate documents.

**Note: Late applications will be considered ONLY if vacancies exist**

### **Selection Process includes:**

- Assessment of written application
- SLP staff observation in primary school
- Panel Assessment finalised
- Parents notified in writing

### ***Documents required with your application include:***

- Most recent School Report.
- Most recent NAPLAN Report.
- Diagnosis of Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD) – report from paediatrician and other relevant professionals.
- Psychologist and Speech Pathology report.
- Signed Permission to Release and/or exchange information form (attached).

Transition of your child, if successful, will be conducted during Term 4, 2023.

## **TEACHING AND LEARNING SUPPORT at OCEAN REEF SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL**

### **Specialist Learning Program - Autism**

Ocean Reef SHS is an Independent Public School and one of a selected number of Secondary Schools in the metropolitan area to offer the Specialist Learning Program – Autism that supports students with Autistic Spectrum Disorders in Years 7 to 12. The program is fully supported by the School of Special Education Needs Disabilities (SEND) – Autism Education Services. Once students are enrolled at ORSHS, parents can assume their child will complete their schooling here. If for any reason in the future the funding for the SLP does not continue or your child no longer requires this service, your child would revert to our mainstream with Education Assistant time being allocated as per formulae.

Students eligible for this program have demonstrated their ability to achieve grade levels necessary for success and integration into mainstream secondary school. They demonstrate the potential to access the academic opportunities to be successful in secondary school and beyond. However, they may be at risk of underachieving or disengaging without this program due to barriers associated with executive functioning including communication and/or social skills limiting their full access to the wider curriculum.

The Specialist Learning Program - Autism at Ocean Reef SHS focuses on the achievement of positive academic, behavioural, social and emotional outcomes for each student, to maximise independence and have access to further education and successful employment. Each student works toward achieving their potential and future goals with specialised support which acknowledges their individual learning profile.

### **THE SLP AREA**

This area includes a teaching space for Specialist Learning Program classes in Very Important Life Skills (VILS) and study skills, a quiet area for students needing to self-regulate and a supervised courtyard which is accessible during break times.

### **SPECIALIST STAFF AND SUPPORT**

The Program is fully timetabled with a program co-ordinator, specialist teachers and a team of experienced education assistants who work collaboratively throughout the school and community to promote learning for each student.

The program is delivered across three settings:

- Learning within the general school setting with a mainstream timetable
- Learning within the SLP teaching area
- Learning within the community

### **STUDENT SELECTION AND APPLICATION**

Entry to the program is determined by a qualified panel from Ocean Reef SHS. Applications will be assessed and visits to the Primary School by SLP teachers, to observe suitable applicants, are arranged in May. The school will then notify parents by email as to the outcome of their application. Students accepted into the SLP program will be invited to a transition program in liaison with their Primary School during Term 4, 2023.

The SLP program is designed and resourced to provide for students who meet the following criteria:

- Student has a diagnosis of ASD and a confirmation letter from the paediatrician with the diagnosis.
- Student is academically capable of understanding and coping with content and tasks at grade level and beyond.
- Behaviour is managed independently or through the use of prompts and strategies
- Student independently manages personal care requirements
- Families can provide reliable transport to and from the SLP and be prepared to work with staff to implement effective strategies and maximise success of students in the SLP.
